Floors and hallways

Floor surfaces should be clean and dry.

Carpets should be maintained in flat, tight condition, without loose edges or rips.

Floor surfaces should be kept free of loose boards, protruding nails, cracks or any other tripping hazard.

Lighting should be adequate for safe passage of traffic.

Storage of items in hallways should not obstruct safe walking and passage of wheeled carts.
